The Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community Council is seeking applicants for the following boards.

To apply:

1. Pick up an application from the Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community administration Department front desk or e-mail your request to ardell.moore@srpmic-nsn.gov
2. Specify which board you would like to apply for, as there may be a more detailed application for that board.
3. Fill out the application completely. **INCOMPLETE AND/OR UNSIGNED APPLICATIONS WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED.**
4. Submit application by 5:00pm on the closing date.
5. Generally, it takes a couple of weeks before the applications are presented to the Council for appointment.
6. If appointed, you will be contacted by the Council Secretary.

SALT RIVER LANDFILL BOARD (Re-opened)

- (1) COMMUNITY MEMBER REPRESENTATIVE
- (1) PROFESSIONAL REPRESENTATIVE

As a Community Member or Professional Representative the desired qualities and responsibilities are as follows:

- ✓ Serve under the direction of the SRPMIC Tribal Council
- ✓ Attend Meetings on the second and fourth Monday of each month, or when necessarily called upon.
- ✓ Make committed decisions for the Community integrity and Indian Culture.
- ✓ Able to attend workshops or conferences.
- ✓ Follow procedures according to Salt River Ordinances Section 17-6.

APPLICANTS FOR THE PROFESSIONAL REPRESENTATIVE MUST HAVE: Extensive professional or management experience in the construction or waste management industry, experience in banking and finance and/or experience in structural, environmental, or civil engineering.

As a board member you will receive a paid stipend for regular and special meetings.

GAMING REGULATORY BOARD (Re-Opened)

- (1) COMMUNITY MEMBER REPRESENTATIVE

The Board is primarily responsible for oversight of the SRPMIC gaming operations to assure compliance with rules and regulations. Must be able to commit to a three (3) year term.

DESIRED QUALITIES:

- Follow procedures according to SR Ordinance 219-96
- Knowledge of SRPMIC Gaming Ordinance and State Compact
- Knowledge of National Indian Gaming Commission (NIGC) Regulations
- Knowledge of the Community's vision
- Background in gaming and/or legal experience
- Be able to attend regularly scheduled meetings and special meetings if needed.

Board members are compensated a stipend for regularly scheduled and/or special called meetings.

Law Enforcement Commission

4 Positions Open

- (1) COMMUNITY MEMBER AT LARGE
- (1) YOUTH REPRESENTATIVE (21-25 yrs.)
- (2) REPRESENTATIVE w/LAW ENFORCEMENT OR DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS EXPERTISE

Be willing to serve a three-year term.

Be willing and able to regularly attend meetings.

Have knowledge of the Community's vision and land issues.

Experience in some of the following areas would be helpful and/or required: Law Enforcement, Community Code of Ordinances.

Additionally, applicants will be required to authorize the SRPD to investigate his/her background through the National Crime Information Center and the AZ Criminal Information Center.

Applicants must pass a drug screening and sign a Code of Ethics statement.

If selected, prior to being seated on the LEC, shall execute a sworn affidavit that certifies that s/he has:

No current outstanding warrants from any jurisdiction or currently under investigation in any jurisdiction.

No misdemeanor criminal history for the previous four (4) years in any jurisdiction.

Never have been convicted of a felony from any jurisdiction.

No more than two (2) moving traffic violations within the last year in any jurisdiction.

Not been terminated from a Police Department, SRP-MIC Department of Corrections from any jurisdiction, for any reason; and,

No termination from any place of employment for reasons involving moral turpitude.

The purpose of the Law Enforcement Commission is to aid in the effective, efficient and objective provision of police and corrections services to members and residents of the Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community (SRPMIC).

The Law Enforcement Commission shall assist the SRPMIC Police Department and the Department of Corrections by acting as a liaison with the Community in matters involving the SRP-MIC Police Department and the Department of Corrections' needs and concerns. Commissioners receive a stipend for meetings and approved activities related to Commission duties.

IMPORTANT NOTE: There is an application specifically for the Law Enforcement Board. When picking up an application make sure you inform Administration that you need a Law Enforcement board application.

EDUCATION BOARD (Re-Opened)

(2) COMMUNITY MEMBER REPRESENTATIVES
(1) PROFESSIONAL REPRESENTATIVE*

IMPORTANT NOTE: *There is an application specifically for the Education Board because of the Special Clearances required. When picking up an application make sure you inform Administration that you need an Education Board Application.*

- Willing to serve a 3-year term.
- Applicant must be at least 25 years of age.
- Must be a dedicated person committed to the mission of the Community's Education Department.
- *Professional Board members must hold a college degree from a 4-year accredited university.
- Education Department and/or SRPMI Community Schools employees are not eligible to apply.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Attendance at regular, special, and educational meetings, work sessions, conferences, workshops, interviews, and special events within and outside of the community and state.
- Members may also be selected for sub-committees.

CLEARANCES

- Members are required to pass a background and fingerprint check.

MEETINGS

- Regular Board meetings are normally held the 1st and 3rd Monday of every month, starting at 5:15pm. "Special" meetings and Work Sessions are scheduled as needed, normally at 5:15pm, however, daytime (8am-5pm) hours may be necessary.

STIPEND

- Members receive a stipend for Regular and "Special" meetings only.

SALT RIVER DEVCO ENTERPRISE BOARD

(1) COMMUNITY MEMBER REPRESENTATIVE

Salt River Devco ("Devco") is an enterprise of the Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community ("Community"), and was created by the Tribal Council to aid in the economic development of the Community. Its primary focus is to engage in the business of real estate development and asset management for commercial properties within the Community.

Applications are being accepted for a Salt River Community Member Representative on the nine-member Salt River Devco Board. If appointed, the new Board Member will serve a three-year term. Knowledge of development and the operation of commercial real estate, banking & financial services, and land planning is helpful but not required. Previous experience on an SRPMIC enterprise Board would also be valuable.

All Devco Board members are reviewed for any possible conflict of interest, and must sign a Confidentiality Agreement and a Conflict of Interest Agreement. Board members must be willing and able to attend regularly scheduled meetings and special meetings if needed and will receive a stipend for regular and committee meetings, as well as for special meetings. **The deadline for submitting an application is July 30, 2011.**

Salt River Devco is an enterprise of the Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community, created by the Tribal Council to aid in the commercial development of the Community. Its primary focus is to engage in the business of real estate investment and management of commercial buildings within the Community and currently along the 101.

Due to term expiration, applications are being accepted for a Professional Representative on the nine-member Salt River Devco Board. If appointed, the new Board Member is anticipated to serve until 12/31/2012. Professional Board Members shall have a college degree from a four-year accredited university, have a minimum of 10 years current experience in executive positions for a company involved with the development and financing of commercial real estate in the Phoenix Metro area, and served on other Board of Directors. Experience with and knowledge of the Salt River Indian Community and/or with other Native American communities is preferred. We are looking for a passionate director to enrich our Board.

All Devco Board Members are reviewed for any possible conflict of interest, and all Members sign a Confidentiality Agreement and a Conflict of Interest Agreement. Board Members must be willing and able to attend monthly scheduled meetings and special meetings if needed and will receive a stipend for regular and committee meetings.
