

NOTICE OF SALT RIVER PIMA-MARICOPA INDIAN COMMUNITY 2014 REFERENDUM ELECTION



Monday, November 17, 2014
Polls open from 6:00am – 6:00pm

The purpose of the election is to see if a majority of voters agree that individuals convicted of serious crimes should not be eligible to receive per capita for a certain period of time. The purpose of this change is to deter Community members from committing serious crimes, including gang-related crimes.

WHO CAN VOTE:

Generally, you are registered to vote in a Community election if you are: 1) an enrolled member of the Community, 2) 18 years or older on the day of the election, and 3) a resident of the relevant electoral district for at least one (1) year; or if you are a non-resident, you declare a home district and vote in that district. *Persons who are a prisoner in jail or prison on the date of election, or who have been declared mentally incompetent are not eligible to vote on election day.

POLLING SITES.

District I (Salt River) voters vote at SALT RIVER COMMUNITY BUILDING located at 10,000 E. McDowell Road, Scottsdale 85256.

District II (Lehi) voters vote at LEHI COMMUNITY BUILDING located at 1231 E. Oak Street, Mesa 85203.

WHAT DISTRICT DO I VOTE IN?

A Community members who lives West of North Mesa Drive is a District I (Salt River) voter and their polling site is at the Salt River Community Building. A Community Member who live East of Mesa Drive is a District II (Lehi) voter and their polling site is at the Lehi Community Building.

A SRPMIC TRIBAL ID IS REQUIRED TO VOTE.

Community members must show a (picture) tribal ID card at the polls before they can vote. You must contact the Office of Membership Services at (480) 362-7600 if you need a new tribal ID card.
