Tuesday, June 21

SRPMIC Honoring Our Leaders: 25 Years of Wisdom & Foresight

Honoring the Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community leadership - Office of the President, Vice President and Council. The past twenty-five years have been transformative for the Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community. The leadership, building on the foundation set by past leaders, made decisions that changed the landscape forever. These decisions proved wise and even prescient. These stories are told by the leaders of those critical decisions, from allowing the Loop 101 Pima Freeway to run through the land, to opening gaming facilities, to expanding the model for economic development. It highlights important partnerships during this period, relationships that continue today to benefit Salt River and others who live in the region and the state.

For the Generations: Native Story and Performance

Told through original performance footage and the artists' own words, the program explores health and fitness issues that plague Native youth on and off the reservations. Artists profiled in the documentary include pop-diva, "Urban Indian," Jana Mashonee; classically trained ballet dancers Michael Greyyeyes and Santee Smith; Grammy winners Robert Mirabal and Bill Miller; funky R&B songstress Martha Redbone; Painted Sky's own Northstar dancers and a host of others. Part performance, part behind-the-scenes footage and interviews, the documentary profiles the personal stories of the artists in their own words--weaving a narrative through the performances that lends gift and personality to the beautiful artistry showcased.

Spirit Glass

"Art has always been a way to showcase what is going on in a community. We have adapted beads to being our art form. It is definitely a part of our identity." - Ervanna Little Eagle (Warm Springs). Celebrate the spectacular beadwork and culture of the Columbia River Plateau People through the eyes and hearts of the artists. Together, they share their history, motivation and the beadwork that plays an important role in binding their culture together. Native Plateau beadwork and culture is unique and its story of survival is a part of the rich tapestry of America. Narrated by Nez Perce storyteller Nakia Williamson, *Spirit in Glass: Plateau Native Beadwork* features artists from the Warm Springs, Yakama, and Umatilla Reservations.

Sacred Stick

Sacred Stick examines the historical, cultural, and spiritual aspects of lacrosse. From the ancient Maya to the world famous Iroquois Nationals team, this program explores a uniquely Indigenous sport that, like Native peoples themselves, adapted and endured within the dominant culture. As lacrosse surges in popularity, it has now become the fastest growing sport in North America. But for Native peoples, it has always been and continues to be much more than a game.

Skin Stories

Every tattoo tells a story. The Samoan culture calls it *tatau*. The Maori people call it *moko* or *puhoro*. The Hawaiians refer to it as *kakau* or *uhi*. And many others know it as tattoo. Many people do not understand the significance this art form holds in many cultures across the globe. For some people, the mark of the tattoo symbolizes their true essence, who they are and where they come from. For others, the tattoo is a symbol of rebirth, a symbol of beauty, and a mark of traditions, values, beliefs, and philosophies.

Thursday, June 23

Scottsdale AutoShow at Salt River

First master planned auto park development in the U.S. since 2008 and first on tribal land, called the Scottsdale AutoShow at Salt River. A 70-acre development with 9 to 11 full service dealership facilities.

Way of the Warrior

This documentary examines the visceral nature of war and the bravery of Native-American veterans who served in World War I, World War II, the Korean War and the Vietnam War--and came to grips with the difficult post-war personal and societal conditions. The program honors the endurance and sacrifice of individuals such as Mitchell Red Cloud (Ho-Chunk), a Congressional Medal of Honor recipient; Ira Hayes (Pima), one of the flag raisers on Iwo Jima; Phil Coon (Creek), a Bataan Death March survivor; and John Yahola (Creek), a member of the Red Stick Warrior society. Their stories are examined through the prism of what it means to be "ogichidaa," one who protects and follows the way of the warrior. Dramatic historical footage, period photographs and sound effects juxtaposed with photos of veterans in more genial settings, away from combat with family and friends stateside, create portrait of not just the warrior, but the paradox of a warrior's motivations.

Horse Tribe

Legendary as one of America's greatest horse tribes, the 21st century Nez Perce decided to bring horses back to their land and lives with the unlikely help of a charismatic Navajo horseman, Rudy Shebala. His mentorship guides at-risk teenagers toward the strong medicine of horses, and his equine skills bring historic *Nez Perce* horse culture to modern renown. But his personal demons imperil both accomplishments. Horse Tribe is an epic story about the connection of human to animal, history to life, individuals to community, grief to resolve, and values to action.
