

Under mandated guidelines set forth by federal law, the Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community (SRPMIC) is implementing changes to its sex offender registry and notification system. These changes are being prompted by the Adam Walsh Child Protection and Safety Act of 2006, a federal law that sets national standards for sex offender registries.

Individuals may request e-mail notifications of sex offender activity within the SRPMIC registry database.

SOME NEW REQUIREMENTS UNDER SORNA INCLUDE:

- Implementing an electronic database for registered sex offenders who live, work or attend school in the SRPMIC boundary.
- Dependant on certain categories, offenders may need to register for a minimum of 15 years to a lifetime maximum.
- Registered offenders are required to arrange in-person visits and submit DNA samples, residential and work addresses, photos and other information.
- Sex offenders with past and present convictions from tribal, county, state and federal courts will be required to register.
- Registrations will take place at the Salt River Police
 Department Indian School Substation (11561 E. Indian School Road, Scottsdale, AZ).
