What is a Brownfields site?

Are you living or working near a Brownfields site?

- A Brownfields property is described under the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) as a “real property, the expansion, redevelopment, or reuse of which may be complicated by the presence or potential presence of a hazardous substance, pollutant, or contaminant.”
- It could be any property such as land or an abandoned building that sits underdeveloped and/or unused because of perceived or actual contamination.



Examples of Brownfield sites:

- ▶ abandoned warehouses
- ▶ old buildings/factories
- ▶ abandoned industrial buildings
- ▶ meth labs
- ▶ abandoned gas stations
- ▶ landfills
- ▶ mine scarred lands

How can you help us find sites?

- ▶ Do you know of old abandoned buildings?
- ▶ Are there any dump sites that you have seen around the Community?
- ▶ Do you know of places where hazardous material may have been used in the past?
- ▶ Do you know of spills of contaminants in the Community?
- ▶ Can you think of a place that could be a Brownfield site?
