


HELP SALT RIVER SCHOOLS BY COMPLETING THE 2020 U.S. CENSUS

WHY IS THE CENSUS SO CRITICAL FOR STUDENTS AND EDUCATORS?

- Census data determine the distribution of more than \$800 billion, including programs that help our students. Some of those programs provide supports for children with special needs and those from low-income families.
- These funds help schools reduce class sizes, hire specialists, continuously bolster teacher quality, offer preschool to low-income families, and ensure that hungry students can get breakfast or lunch to help them pay attention in class.
- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), which keeps millions of families out of poverty and has lasting benefits for children's health and academic success.

IN THE 2010 CENSUS, NEARLY 1 MILLION CHILDREN (4.6% OF CHILDREN UNDER THE AGE OF 5) WERE NOT COUNTED. CHILDREN UNDER AGE 5 ARE ONE OF THE LARGEST UNDERCOUNTED GROUPS.
