# FROM THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS

#### **BURIAL BENEFITS ELIGIBILITY**

- 1. Find out if you or your veteran family member are eligible. Eligibility criteria is:
  - A Veteran who didn't receive a dishonorable discharge when the Service Member separated from the military, or
  - The spouse or dependent child of a Service Member or Veteran, even if the Service Member or Veteran has already passed away, or
  - In some cases, the adult dependent child of a Service Member or Veteran (if you aren't married) the VA bases its decisions of whether or not you or a veteran family member qualify for burial in a VA national cemetery on service history—or the service history of the Veteran or Service Member who's sponsoring your application for burial as a spouse, surviving spouse, or unmarried adult child.

**Note:** If a Service Member dies on active duty, they're eligible for burial without a pre-need decision letter. Visit
